



**RESOLUTION IN MEMORIAM
OF
ROBERT C. CANNADA**

Robert C. Cannada was called to his Heavenly Home on July 5, 2007 at the age of 86 following a lengthy illness and the Session remembers his life and his contributions with the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Robert C. Cannada was born in Edwards, Mississippi on July 29, 1920, attended school in Raymond, Mississippi and was admitted to the University of Mississippi School of Law in September, 1939; and

WHEREAS, Bob Cannada served as an officer in the United States Navy during World War II, and following World War II, he joined the Jackson law firm of Stevens & Cannada, and later, following his service in the Korean Conflict, Bob Cannada's firm merged with the firm of Butler, Snow & O'Mara; and

WHEREAS, Bob married Inez Chisolm Cannada and had three sons, Robert C. (Ric) Cannada, Jr., Paul Davis Cannada, and R. Barry Cannada, but was preceded in death by his wife, Inez and his son Dave; and

WHEREAS, Scripture provides: "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. And there are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons. But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (I Corinthians 12:4-7) (NAV); and

WHEREAS, Robert C. Cannada's gifts found expression in his vision and his persistent enthusiasm as he served for more than 45 years as a Ruling Elder of First Presbyterian Church; as he led in the formation of Presbyterian Church in America and in the preparation of the Book
