DAVIS LOVE FAIR, JR.

WHEREAS, our Heavenly Father has called our beloved brother in Christ, Davis L. Fair, Jr., to his eternal rest and heavenly home on March 13, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Davis Love Fair, Jr. was born on January 25, 1914, to Davis Love Fair, Sr. and Belle Fair. He attended the Louisville Public Schools before graduating from Gulf Coast Military Academy in Gulfport, entered the University of Mississippi where he was active in Phi Delta Theta Fraternity and a member of ODK honorary society, served as manager of the Ole Miss Basketball team, and an M-Club member before graduating in 1936; and

WHEREAS, Davis L. Fair, Jr. served his country during World War II as a Captain in the Army Air Corp.; and

WHEREAS, Davis L. Fair, Jr. served as Vice-President of D. L. Fair Lumber Company in Louisville, Mississippi, from 1948 to 1952, and as President of the company from 1952 to 1965 when it was purchased by Georgia Pacific; and

WHEREAS, Davis L. Fair, Jr. was active in timber related organizations, having served as a director of the National Oak Flooring Manufacturers' Association, the Southern Pine Association, the South Pine Association, and President of the Mississippi Forestry Association and Tree Farmer of the Year in Winston County, Mississippi; and


WHEREAS, Davis L. Fair, Jr. was active and generous of his time in his community, having served as President of the Louisville Rotary Club, a Trustee and President of the Louisville School Board, a Trustee of French Camp Academy, and named Louisville Man of the Year in 1982; and


