

**RESOLUTION IN MEMORIAM
OF
MILLARD FARMER HUBBARD**

WHEREAS, Millard Farmer Hubbard was born on November 26, 1911, in Newman, Georgia, and having completed his secondary education, he was graduated from Georgia School of Technology in 1935 with a degree in electrical engineering; and

WHEREAS, having begun his career with General Electric, Millard served as quality engineer in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, and Newark, New Jersey, and thereafter served in operations capacities at Seaboard Lamp, Trumbull Lamp and East Cleveland Lamp; and

WHEREAS, Millard was transferred from his position in Cleveland, Ohio, to a post as quality engineer in Jackson, Mississippi, in 1939 and thereafter assisted in opening General Electric's fluorescent lamp plant in Jackson; and

WHEREAS, Millard rose to the level of Plant Manager in 1948, a position in which he served until his retirement in 1976; and

WHEREAS, Millard joined the fellowship of First Presbyterian Church on July 16, 1950, and was subsequently elected to the office of Deacon on February 14, 1960; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 1979, Millard was ordained as an Elder; and

WHEREAS, Millard F. Hubbard served in many capacities within the Church, including the position of Superintendent of the Sunday School Junior Department; and

WHEREAS, Millard F. Hubbard served the community in various memberships including the Jackson Rotary Club and in his tenure on the Boards of the American Red Cross, the United Givers Fund, the Jackson School Board, and the Young Men's Christian Association; and


WHEREAS, Millard Farmer Hubbard went to be with his Lord and Savior on October 5,


