



Memorial Resolution
Edward Oswell "Ed" Nalley
January 20, 1936-December 30, 2009

- Whereas:** Our Lord in His infinite wisdom foreordained that Otho Murdock and Mary Louise Nalley, Godly parents, would have their seventh child Edward on January 20, 1936, and,
- Whereas:** Ed accepted Christ at an early age and joined Carmel Baptist Church in Kolin, Louisiana, and,
- Whereas:** Ed enlisted in the U.S. Navy on June 15, 1955, to serve his country on the aircraft carrier the ORISKANY and the destroyer LOFBERG where he maintained communications equipment until his discharge on June 8, 1959, receiving decorations for his thirty-four years of service, and,
- Whereas:** He began his Federal Aviation Administration career on March 14, 1960, in Jackson, MS and retired on May 30, 1994, and,
- Whereas:** Ed married his sweetheart Miss Janie Elizabeth Devine on February 18, 1962, and is survived by her after forty-seven years of marriage, and,
- Whereas:** Ed served ten years and three months as a Deacon and as an Elder four years at St. Paul Presbyterian Church, and eighteen years and three months at Alta Woods Presbyterian Church, and two years at Lakeland Presbyterian Church and Clerk of Session for four months, and,
- Whereas:** Ed and Janie raised their covenant children Glen and Gary and have been blessed with six grandchildren and three great grandchildren, and,
- Whereas:** Ed was a member of the "Convocation of Sessions to Form the PCA" on January 7, 1973. He attended all General Assemblies through June, 2004, as the Sound Systems Director, and,
- Whereas:** Ed was granted Elder Emeritus status on May 12, 2004, after serving the Lord's church as an undershepherd of the flock for thirty-six years, and,
- Whereas:** It pleased the Lord Jesus Christ to call His servant to Himself on December 30, 2009, after a full life of ministry in His church, and,
